ARTICLE FORMATTING REQUIREMENTS:

- Length: 5-7 pages maximum.
- The article must be prepared in Doc format, font: Times New Roman, line spacing: 1, font-size: 12, margins: top and bottom – 20 mm, right – 15 mm, left – 30 mm.
- The title of the article should not exceed 12 words.
- The title must be provided in the language of the article and translated into English.
- An abstract should be written in English and placed before the main text.
- After the abstract, 5 keywords must be listed.
- The main text of the article should follow the keywords, separated by two line breaks.

Author information: After the article's title, leave a one-line space, then provide the author's full name. A reference mark (*) should be used next to the name to include the academic degree, title, position, organization, and email address.

References and citation formatting:

- Citations should be provided in square brackets, indicating the author's last name, year of publication, and page number.

Example: [Aidarbekov, 2010: 15].

- The reference list should be included at the end of the article in the order of appearance.

- A minimum of 5 sources should be referenced.

ZEYNABIL SMAILKHANOVICH AIDARBEKOV

Professor of the Department of Philosophy at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Doctor of Philosophy, and member of the Philosophical Congress of Kazakhstan.

Zeynabil Smailkhanovich was born to a miner's family on September 17, 1964, in the city of Lengir, Turkestan region. He graduated from the Higher Comsomol School under the Central Committee of the All-Union Leninist Young Communist League (now Moscow Humanitarian University) in Moscow. He completed a master's program at the Academy of Public Administration under the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan in 2010 and has undergone international internships and training at leading public policy schools in the USA, Singapore, the Netherlands, China, Bulgaria, and other countries.

Aidarbekov Z.S. began his professional career as a construction worker at the Lengir Construction Department from 1981 to 1983. From 1983 to 1985, he served in the Soviet Army, excelling in political education and achieving the rank of sergeant. In 1985, on the recommendation of the Main Political Administration of the Soviet Army and Navy, he admitted to the Higher Komsomol School in Moscow. After graduating, he worked as an organizational secretary for the Shymkent City Committee of the Leninist Komsomol (LKSM) of Kazakhstan. In 1991, he transitioned to business, serving as General Director of the production company LLC "Talap," gaining significant experience in market conditions across Kazakhstan. From August 1993 to June 1995, he managed the International Trade House "Atakent-Sauda" at the Atakent Center for Trade and Economic Cooperation and from 1995 to 1997, he was the Director of the Joint Stock Company "Pikat." In April 1997, he joined the Institute of Philosophy and Political Science at the Ministry of Education and Science of Kazakhstan as a research fellow. In 1997, he defended his candidate dissertation in social philosophy on the topic "Social Behavior of the Individual in Market Conditions" at Al-Farabi Kazakh National University.

From March 1998 to July 2000, he served as Deputy Chief Editor at the Main Editorial Office of the "Kazakh Encyclopedia". From August 2000 to 2002, he was the Director of the service company "Kazkomservice-Aksai" at the Karachaganak field, ZKO. Since August 2002, he has been an Associate Professor at the Eurasia Institute of Management and World Languages in Oral. Since February 2003, he has been as an Associate Professor, Vice-Rector, and Rector's Advisor at ZKGU named after M. Utemisov in Oral.

From 2004 to 2014, he held various positions, including Head of Sector in the Presidential Administration of Kazakhstan, Deputy Director of the Presidential Archive, and pursued studies at the Academy of Public Administration under the President of Kazakhstan as part of the first intake of the National School of Public Policy. In 2008, he became a leading research fellow at the Institute of Philosophy and Political Science, Ministry of Education and Science of Kazakhstan. In 2009, he defended his doctoral dissertation in social philosophy on "Social and Philosophical Analysis of the Ideological and Value Orientations of Youth in the Republic of Kazakhstan" at the Institute of Philosophy and Political Science, Ministry of Education and Science of Kazakhstan.

From May 2014 to September 2023, he served as the Head of the Department of History and Social Sciences at the Kazakh University of International Relations and World Languages named after Ablai Khan. In 2016, he became a Professor at Moscow Humanitarian University. In 2019, he appointed as a Professor at the International University of HZASAG named after Chinggis Khan in Mongolia, Honorary Professor at Beijing Petroleum University, and member of the Russian Philosophical Society and the Kazakh Philosophical Congress. He is also a member of the editorial board of the scientific journal "Academic Council" in Moscow. In September 2023, he returned to Al-Farabi Kazakh National University as a Professor in the Department of Philosophy. Zeynabil Smailkhanovich has published over 100 articles, authored 5 monographs, and holds 2 patents. From 2014 to 2022, he led the "Bureau for the Affairs of Disabled Persons," assisting young people with disabilities.
